The humble beginning.

In 1988, Dean and Prayeri Harrison founded Out of Africa Wildlife Park, a preserve born from their single-minded objective of bringing God, people, and animals together in a natural setting. Married in 1980, neither of them could predict what adventures would unfold when they first met. Dean began learning to interpret animal behavior from his reptile friends during his childhood, while Prayeri shared a fascination with an assortment of cat, dog, and bird pets that she grew up with. This deep-rooted fascination of the animal world was the underpinning of what would one day become a 104-acre wildlife preserve featuring hundreds of exotic animals, a location filled with serenity and adventure.

It all began in Southern California when Dean and Prayeri welcomed a baby African leopard named Saja into their hearts and home, sharing everything from their bed, their food, and their life. In return, this wild and survival-oriented creature provided them the priceless



experience of understanding life from a wild animal's point of view, and in so doing, created a companionship between human and animal.

Saja revealed what was to become their calling, that of illuminating for others the genuine connectedness between human and animal spirituality. As Saja grew, so did her need for companionship with other similar creatures, thus directing the Harrisons to gradually add other big, exotic cats to their family, including a tiger, a cougar, and a lion, all of whom were raised from cubs.

This necessitated a move to an adequate, fully integrated, human/animal abode where the animals could freely roam their own outdoor habitats, or chose to spend time with Dean and Prayeri inside their home. It was that decision that led them to Oregon.

To some, co-existing with the wildest of large land predators may seem foolish, yet it was necessary to do things in a nontraditional, non-cultured way, to earnestly





look from the predator's eyes as they learned from them and fulfilled their needs. Dean and Prayeri refrained from standard procedures used in circuses or zoos, equally out of respect and love for the animals as their research goals. There would be no whip or chair routine, and the boredom of a zoo setting had to be replaced with purpose and relationships. The lessons learned, and the satisfaction received, have been more than worth it, as evidenced in the spirit of Out of Africa Wildlife Park today.

During this time the Harrisons became known for their beautiful animals and meticulous care of them. They opened their home and facility to the public, calling it **Tigerville**, **USA**. But, the Harrisons wanted to live in Arizona so they eventually moved to the Phoenix area where the original Out of Africa Wildlife Park was formed in Fountain Hills, AZ in 1988. After 16 years, the park was moved 90 miles north to a much larger property in the high desert foothills of the Mingus Mountains in Camp Verde, AZ. As the park grew from 16 acres to 104, so did

the diversity and number of its residents, as well as the size of the habitats so crucial to their stimulation and enrichment. The park opened to the public in May 2005. Visitors and the animals alike enjoy the park's look and feel of Africa, as the vegetation and landscape bear a striking resemblance to many parts of Africa.

Dean and Prayeri's knowledge and understanding of animal behavior and instinct has intensified with each new, "global" resident. They've become experienced in preventive veterinary care, learning best practices in contemporary allopathic thinking as well as in the more esoteric options available in holistic medicine. They also have extensive experience in evaluating and collaborating on medical treatment and assisting at surgeries for injuries and illness.

Dean and Prayeri have traveled to Africa many times on photo safari tours. This experience has imbued in them an overwhelming physical and spiritual sense of "home" and of being one with all of life. These trips have helped them construct authentic habitats, enabling visitors to the park to get a sense of an authentic Africa. Providing others with the opportunity to awaken to this concept has become their greatest pleasure. Every day this concept of oneness is illustrated with unsurpassed majesty.

It's been over 30 years since their grand experiment began. The

enthusiasm Dean and Prayeri have displayed for over three decades now continues to this very day. They have made it their life's calling to share what they have learned by demonstrating these unique relationships to the public, while playing a role in the preservation of exotic animals, many of which are threatened today.

Today, the Harrisons live on the grounds of the park year round, so they can be close to the animals in their charge that they love. Out of Africa Wildlife Park has gained great distinction as a highly respected wildlife park for its unique approach allowing its residents to thrive and flourish because of spacious habitats, preservation and rehabilitation efforts, education, research, and interaction.

From the beginning Dean and Prayeri wanted to know the big cats on a personal basis. They desired harmony and peace between the animals and themselves, and they found it. Ever since then, their lives have been dedicated to the hope that you will find it as well.



The Park opened its current (and only) Camp Verde, AZ, location in May 2005. Conveniently located 30 minutes south of Sedona, 50 minutes south of Flagstaff, and just over an hour north of Phoenix, Out of Africa Wildlife Park is an easy and pleasant drive through the I-17 corridor. Set at an elevation of 3,400 feet, the weather and landscape are similar to the Serengeti in Africa. While the park does not experience snow, it does enjoy slightly cooler temperatures during the summer months. Out of Africa Wildlife Park began as a research project that founders Dean & Prayeri Harrison initiated in their home over 30 years ago. Today, Out of Africa is a successful wildlife park visited by thousands of visitors annually from all around the world. Many people often ask how, "How is all of this possible?"

Dean Harrison wrote a book about their experiences. Published in 1995, "Return to Eden" outlines lessons learned and their application at the park today.



FEATURES

Out Africa Wildlife Park features several shows throughout the day: Creature Feature, Tiger Splash, Giant Snake Show, Feed-a-Tiger, Wonders of Wildlife, Predator Feed, and the African Bush Safari tour into the Serengeti preserve for an interactive tour with the African hoof stock, such as giraffes, zebras, ostriches, watusi, gemsbok, and more. All of this is covered with price of general admission.

Tiger Splash[™] performances are the park's most popular activity. Tiger Splash[™] is everyday at 1:15 p.m. in the Tiger Splash arena and features unrehearsed performances of tigers interacting in a predatory/prey relationship of romping and splashing with caretakers in a large pool.

Creature Feature is featured every day at 11:30 a.m. at Critter Court *unless otherwise specified*. Touch, photograph, and learn about the small mammals, reptiles, or exotic birds.

The African Bush Safari is a 30 to 40 minute adventure in the spacious Serengeti preserve. Surrounded by some of the world's most exotic, free roaming animals, you'll ride in a safari vehicle, complete with expert guide and narration. This tour allows riders to get closer than they ever thought possible to giraffes, zebras, sable antelope, gemsbok, and so many more of the wild-by-nature inhabitants. Some may even get to steal a kiss from a giraffe while feeding with the treats that are provided.

The Wildlife Preserve covers over 100 acres in all. There are several ways to engage the splendor of the Wildlife Preserve, which actually encompasses all aspects of the park, from the free-roaming Serengeti and Masai Mara, to the entertainment arena and courts, even to the spacious habitats located throughout the park. Each element was designed to give you a chance to see these beautiful creatures and their natural behavior up-close. For your benefit, many of these habitats have unobstructed photo platforms that provide you the opportunity to photograph the animals in the purest sense; fence free.

The Predator Feed is featured every Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday at 3:00 p.m. Visitors follow the animal caretakers on this half-hour walking tour as they throw 800 pounds of raw food to anxiously awaiting carnivores. Trams are available on a first come, first served basis for those less inclined to walk. There are plenty of opportunities to take amazing pictures while bears chow, hyenas laugh, and lions roar.

The Giant Snake Show is featured daily at 2:15 p.m. and features an anaconda, python, or a boa constrictor. Visitors may have a hands-on experience if they choose. Enjoy caretaker's enthusiasm for teaching, sharing, and showcasing these intriguing giants, and gain a new respect for the rich diversity of living reptiles removed from the Hollywood hype of fear and anxiety. Brimming with photo opportunities, the *Giant Snake Show* is one unforgettable experience you'll definitely want to get wrapped up in

Wonders of Wildlife, featured every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday at 3:00 p.m., is a rare opportunity to see a variety of unique and exotic animals from a very different perspective. Caretakers interact with interesting animals, such as grizzly bears, spotted hyenas, and others, as they demonstrate their playful nature and cunning skill. Not a circus act but an exciting and educational way to discover the astonishingly colorful world of our animal friends and their unique attributes.

The Gift Shop features an array of fascinating gifts from around the world. Located at the entrance of the park, it's the perfect place to find unique gifts for any occasion: hand painted ostrich eggs, African carved giraffes, jewelry, unique home décor, clothing, books, and music. And, of course, we have the usual souvenirs, sundries, t-shirts, sweatshirts, hats, mugs, games, stuffed animals (big and small), wildlife cards, treats, and specialty items. There's something for everyone, offering many ways to relive your day's adventure.

For those who choose to heighten their Out of Africa Wildlife Experience with a close encounter of the wildest kind, these added excursions offer more personalized and intimate experience. Indulge yourself! Additional costs apply.

Feed-a-Tiger* is the perfect opportunity to personally feed a Siberian or Bengal tiger immediately following the Tiger Splash[™] Show at 2:00 p.m. daily. Witness the power and majesty of these predators up close, in a way you never imagined possible. Cost is **\$5** per person for two pieces of meat. This event is completely safe, as all feedings are done through a protective screen using tongs…not fingers. ^{*}General admission is required for park entry.

The Authentic Unimog Adventure Tour* upgrade allows you to expand the highlights of the general African Bush Safari tour. This hour-long tour takes place on an authentic off-road vehicle known as a Unimog. The experience begins with a drive through the park where your guide will introduce you to many of the inhabitants along the way as you trek toward the inspiring Serengeti. Upon entering the Serengeti Preserve, visitors are transported to the world of roaming African wildlife. Offering incredible photo opportunities, this tour will make the Out of Africa experience even more authentic and memorable. The cost is **\$20** per person regardless of age. Tours operate daily at 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Reservations are recommended, as seats are limited. *****General admission is required for park entry.

The VIP Behind-the Scenes Tour is the perfect way to indulge yourself in an exclusive and private behind-thescenes experience guided by an expert member of our animal team. This in-depth 3-hour adventure will expose patrons to a side of Out of Africa not otherwise seen. Seasoned park guides will expound on many exciting stories, giving visitors a remarkable perspective of the animals, their personalities, behavior, history, and the conservation efforts to protect these marvelous creatures. Don't just see the animals, get to know them on a deeper level in a more personalized and interactive way. This coveted experience is not only unforgettable, but life changing. The VIP begins at 10:00 a.m. and concludes at 1:00 p.m. All general admission activities are included with purchase of VIP, so guests can enjoy the rest of the day partaking in the park's activities and features. **Reservations are required**. Cost is **\$149** per adult, **\$125** for children.
